Or did he have to leave India to succeed? Corporate India is dominated by family businesses. The right genes are still an important requisite for ultimate success. But this is changing slowly. Even promoters are slowly ceding the CEO job to loyal professionals. There are a handful of important companies where shareholding is diversified and that have had professional CEOs for a long time: the Tata group, HDFC, ICICI, L&T, for example. The problem here is that there are so few of them and the CEO tenure in these firms is so long that it creates few opportunities for new leaders to rise.

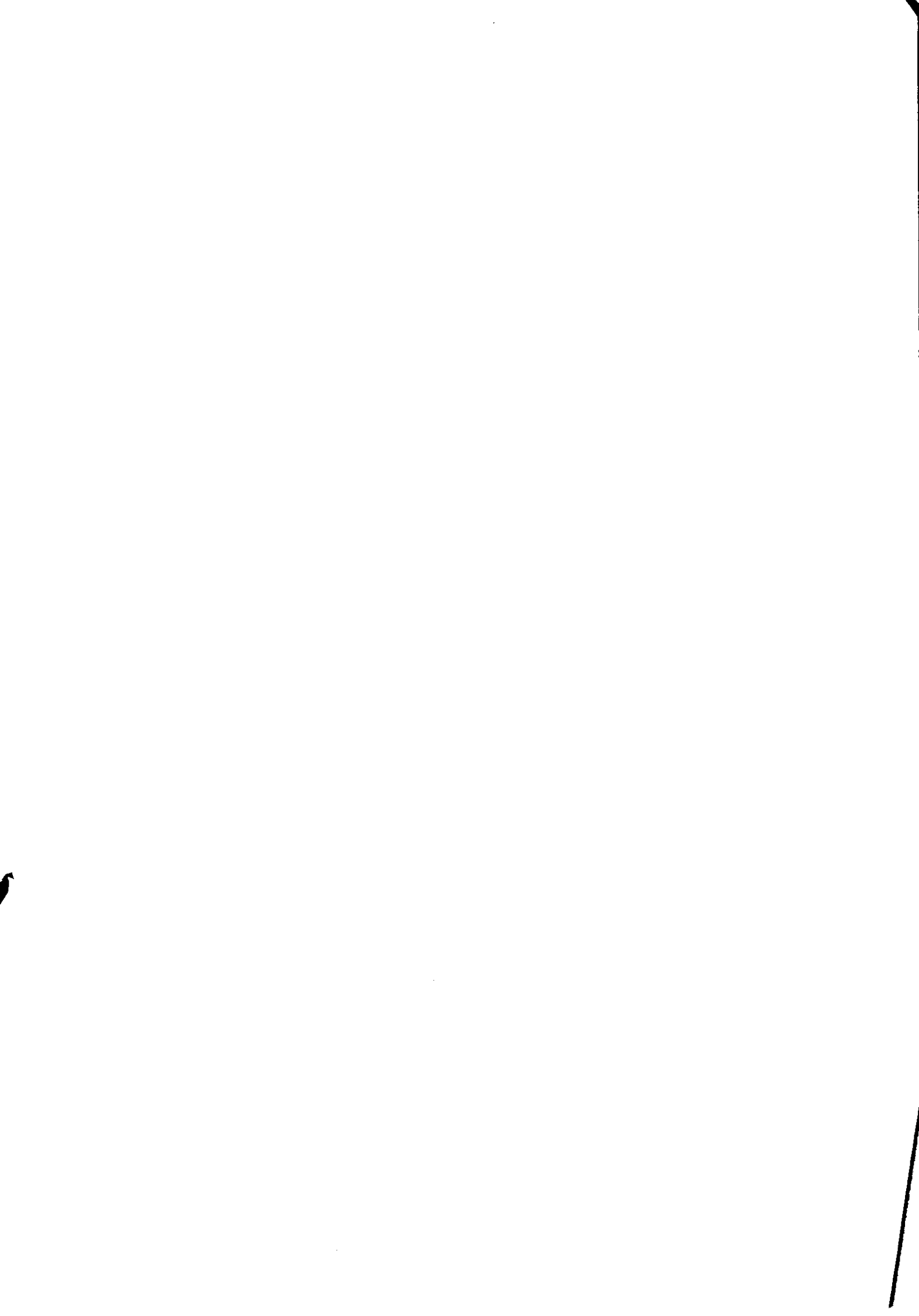
