## Tête-à-Tête with Mr Amit Gupta, Examination In-Charge



**Q.1 Since when have you been working with RMC?**

A: I have been working with RMC for more than two and a half years.

**Q.2 How is your experience with this institution?**

A: My experience with this institution has been very good. I see good opportunities to advance my career. The Management and Principal Madam are very supportive of ideas and suggestions. The institute offers good benefits and provides training to all faculties through Faculty Development Program to continue to learn new skills.

**Q.3 What kind of responsibilities do you have to perform as an examination in-charge?**

A: Being an examination in-charge, I have to be aware about changes in examination pattern each academic year. I have to manage all supervisors, this includes giving guidelines to new invigilators on rules and regulations and changes on annual basis before the examination period. I also have to gather information from co-ordinator's to ensure that students' examination entries are made correctly on-time. I manage examination preparation process with the help of Principal Madam and co-ordinators of various departments.

**Q.4 Does the online trend affect examination work? If yes, How?**

Offline examination system involves a lot of paper-work for marking candidate attendance, for creating a document for sending answer booklets of university level exams. Now, it is less expensive because of less engagement of resources and also information of the

candidates are safe and secured. Offline examination system is very expensive as compared to the online system.

**Q.5 During this crucial time of examination, any guidelines for the students?**

A: Carry your own stationaries with you. Solve previous years question papers. Students must be present in the examination room at least 30 minutes before the exam. Candidates are not allowed to carry any electronic gadgets at the time of examination. Students must carry their ID Cards with them. Queries pertaining to the question paper must be clarified by the block supervisor only. Communication between candidates is strictly forbidden during the exam. Cheating and attempts at cheating will immediately be reported to the university or strict actions will be taken on such candidates. Better, 'No Copy, Be Happy'.
